INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE APPLICANT

Notice: This application packet contains all the information needed to apply to the Doctor of Physical Therapy program in the Department of Physical Therapy at the University of South Alabama. Applicants must adhere to the guidelines set forth in this packet. **No other forms of application will be accepted.**

Please read the material carefully and make sure you have completed or will be able to complete the prerequisite requirements for the appropriate category prior to the beginning of the Fall Semester for which you are applying. Please note that you must indicate on the form your chosen category of admission (Regular Graduate admission or Advanced Undergraduate admission).

Application Deadlines

The application period is from October – January 15th. All application materials must be received/ postmarked on or before **January 15th**. Applications with material received after this date will not be considered. Hand delivered material will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. January 15th. **Note effective 4/2008, minimum GRE is now 900 (V+Q).**

Application Fee

- There is a one-time, non-refundable fee of \$75 (including a \$50 department processing fee and \$25 university Admission’s fee) which must accompany the application.
- Checks, money orders or credit card payment should be made out to the University of South Alabama.

Two Categories of Applicants are Considered for Admission:

It is highly recommended, and in most cases required, that applicants complete a bachelor's degree prior to starting the PT program.

1. Regular Graduate Applicants: These applicants must hold a bachelor's degree in any field from an accredited college or university and complete all prerequisites for regular graduate admission as listed below with a **GPA ≥ 3.00** by the time they would start the PT program, and a **minimum of 900** on the GRE. These applicants may apply in January if they will complete their bachelor's degree before Fall semester.

2. Advanced Undergraduate Applicants: This special "Advanced" early-entry option is reserved for the highly motivated and academically strong student. Students with at least 96 semester or 144 quarter hours of specific college prerequisites listed below, an overall **GPA of ≥ 3.50** , and a **minimum of 900 on the GRE** may apply for entry to the program prior to completion of the bachelor's degree. The student applying with three years of prerequisites is then able to complete the Doctor of Physical Therapy degree with just six years of college. Applicants in this category should carefully review *Additional Information for Advanced Undergraduates* that follows the list of prerequisites.

Admissions rankings for both groups are determined using the same criteria. Acceptance will be based on the student's academic ability and aptitude for a career as a PT including Cumulative and Math/Science prerequisite GPA, GRE scores (V, Q, and writing), and interview score.

Minimum Requirements for All Applicants:

1. The applicant must declare one of the above categories on the application form (deadline January 15th) and meet all applicable requirements including prerequisites.
2. Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores must be officially reported to the University of South Alabama Office of Admissions by January 15th. GRE must have been taken within the last 5 years. A minimum total score of 900 on the Verbal and Quantitative portion is required. Verbal, Quantitative and Analytical Writing sections will be utilized.
3. Regular Graduate applicants must have a minimum 3.0 (A=4.0) overall grade point average (GPA); Advanced Undergraduate applicants must have a minimum 3.5 overall GPA.
4. All applicants must have a minimum grade of "C" in each of the prerequisite courses.
5. Observation or work experience in Physical Therapy (50 hours minimum) under the supervision of a licensed Physical Therapist must be documented. A form is available for download from the website that must be signed by the physical therapist with the license number included.
6. International applicants must have a TOEFL score ≥ 600 , TSE ≥ 60 and TWE ≥ 4.5 and must apply to the University's Office of International Services, with certified translations of transcripts, by **October 15** of the previous year. This entry-level DPT program is not designed for students who already have a physical therapy degree.

Prerequisites Required For All Applicants:

English Composition (2 courses)

Social Science (3 courses – at least two of which must be Psychology)

Precalculus Algebra / Trigonometry or Higher Mathematics (1 course)

Statistics (1 course)

College Physics -with labs (2 semester or 3 quarter sequence)

General Chemistry for science majors -with labs (2 semester or 3 quarter sequence)

General or Cell Biology for science majors -with lab* (2 semester or 3 quarter sequence)

Human Physiology - USA courses are BMD 334 & 335 (preferred).

*Botany may not be used to satisfy this prerequisite.

Additional Prerequisites for Advanced Undergraduate Applicants:

Fine Arts (History or Appreciation) (1 course)

Literature I & II (World Lit, American Lit, or British Lit)

Oral Communication (Speech) (1 course)

History of Civilization or U.S. History (1 course)

Computer Science (1 course)

Microbiology or Infectious Disease (1 course)

Electives (21 Semester hours)**

For Advanced Undergraduate applicants, prerequisites must total at least 96 semester hours.

**Electives should be concentrated in a back-up major of the student's choice.

NOTE: For all prerequisite courses, credits older than ten years from the application deadline must be repeated or validated by examination or other appropriate mechanism.

Recommended Courses:

A number of courses are determined to be good preparation for certain components of the PT graduate program and therefore are recommended if they fit into the applicant's preparation: Microbiology or Infectious Disease (one is required for Advanced Undergraduate applicants), Medical Terminology, Kinesiology, Exercise Physiology, Basic Motor Learning, upper level Anatomy, Neuroscience, Pathophysiology, Abnormal Psychology, Physiological Psychology, Developmental Psychology.

Additional Information for Advanced Undergraduate Applicants:

Students who have completed 96 semester or 144 quarter hours of prescribed and elective course work and who meet all admission criteria and the terms specified below are eligible for application to the program. Thus, these students may be able to complete the DPT degree in 6 years from entry into college.

In addition to the minimum admission requirements listed above, advanced undergraduate applicants also must acknowledge an understanding of the following:

- That according to University policy, no more than 64 semester hours of transfer credit from two-year colleges will be accepted.
- That they will be officially classified as an undergraduate for the first 2 semesters of the program but will be taking graduate courses of the DPT program.
- That in the first 2 semesters of the program, while classified as undergraduate students, any financial aid is restricted to the types and amounts for which undergraduate students are eligible.
- That upon satisfactory completion (minimum GPA of 3.0 in all course work) of the first 2 semesters of the program, they will be awarded the Bachelor of Science in Pre-professional Health Science degree. These students must then complete application for reclassification and admission to the Graduate School. Upon satisfactory completion of the next 6 semesters of the DPT program, students will be awarded the Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) degree.
- That tuition will be assessed at the graduate level for the entire 8 semesters of the professional program.
- That the academic program for students in both categories is identical in its entirety.
- That for the entire 8 semesters of the program they will be held to the same standards and policies as students enrolled in the graduate school (see the policies of the Graduate School).

Selection Process

Admissions rankings are determined using a calculation that includes identical components for both groups of applicants. A limited number of applicants are invited for interview with the PT faculty and PT clinicians from the community based upon academic ability including Cumulative GPA, GPA emphasizing Math/Science prerequisites, and GRE scores and aptitude for a career as a physical therapist. **Final admission decisions are based upon GPA, GRE and interview score.**

Students accepted into the program must submit completed health and physical exam forms to include required immunizations. Accepted students must also read, sign and submit the Core Performance Standards document outlining fundamental tasks which applicants should be capable of performing upon entering the PT program.

CORE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR ADMISSION TO, PROGRESSION IN AND COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAM IN PHYSICAL THERAPY.

General Abilities

To provide quality health care, the student is expected to possess functional use of the senses of vision, touch, hearing, taste, and smell. All data received by the senses must be integrated, analyzed and synthesized in a consistent and accurate manner. In addition, the individual is expected to possess the ability to perceive pain, pressure, temperature, position, equilibrium, and movement.

Observational Ability

The student is expected to participate in and observe demonstrations and experiments in the basic sciences including but not limited to physiologic and pharmacologic demonstrations in animals, microbiologic cultures and microscopic study of organisms and tissues in normal and pathologic states. The student is expected to observe the patient accurately at a distance and close at hand and accurately assess health/illness alteration. Inherent in this observation process is the functional use of the senses and sufficient motor capability to carry out the necessary assessment activities.

Communication Ability

The student is expected to be able to effectively communicate verbally and non-verbally and to observe patients in order to elicit information, describe changes in mood, activity, and postures and to perceive non-verbal communications. This requires the ability to read, write, and effectively utilize the English language. The student must be able to communicate effectively and sensitively with patients.

Motor Ability

The student is expected to be able to perform gross and fine motor movements required to provide physical therapy and operate equipment to deliver care safely. Examples of movements the student must be able to perform include lifting, turning, transferring, transporting, and exercising the patients. The student is expected to have the psychomotor skills necessary to perform or assist with procedures, treatments, administration of medication, managing of equipment, and emergency interventions. The student is expected to be able to maintain consciousness and equilibrium, and have the physical strength and stamina to perform satisfactorily in clinical experiences.

The student should have sufficient motor function to elicit information from patients by palpation, auscultation, percussion and other diagnostic maneuvers. The student must be able to do laboratory tests and work with scientific and other instruments and machinery utilized in the practice of physical therapy. The student should have motor skills necessary to administer emergency treatment such as CPR. Such actions require coordination of both fine and gross muscular movements, equilibrium and functional use of the senses of touch and vision.

Critical Thinking Ability

The student is expected to have the ability to develop problem solving skills. This includes the ability to measure, calculate, analyze and synthesize objective as well as subjective data and make decisions that reflect consistent and thoughtful deliberation and clinical judgment. In addition, the student should be able to comprehend three dimensional relationships and understand the spatial relationships of structures.

Interpersonal Abilities

The student is expected to have the emotional stability required to exercise sound judgment, and complete assessment and intervention activities. The student is expected to establish rapport and maintain sensitive, interpersonal relationships with individuals, families and groups from a variety of social, emotional, cultural, and intellectual backgrounds. The student is expected to have the flexibility to function effectively under stress. Concern for others, integrity, accountability, interest and motivation are necessary personal qualities.

Behavioral and Social Attributes

A student must possess the emotional health required for full utilization of his/her intellectual abilities, the exercise of good judgment, the prompt completion of all responsibilities attendant to the diagnosis and care of patients, and the development of mature, sensitive and effective relationships with patients. Students must be able to tolerate physically taxing workloads and to function effectively under stress. Students must be able to adapt to changing environments, to display flexibility and to learn to function in the face of uncertainties inherent in the clinical problems of many patients. Compassion, integrity, concern for others, interpersonal skills, interest and motivation are all personal qualities that should be assessed during the admissions and education processes.

Individuals with disabilities are encouraged to apply to the program. However, it is the responsibility of the student to notify the Chairperson of the Department of Physical Therapy (see below) if there is any reason why the abilities/expectations described above cannot be met. Students who indicate that they cannot meet one or more of these and who request a review in writing will be reviewed by the Departmental Faculty Committee and the Coordinator of Special Student Services to determine what, if any, reasonable accommodations might be possible to facilitate successful completion of the degree requirements.
