We will be commissioning six Second Lieutenants: Ricardo Brito, Jonathan Byrd, Krista Blue, Chad Nelson, Michelle McDevitt and David Hickman. When **COL (P) Robert W. Kenyon** pins on his one star he will be only the second graduate of the USA Army ROTC program to be promoted to General Officer rank. The only other graduate is **BG Mike Sumrall** from the class of 1970.

The Jaguar Army ROTC Battalion offered 40 four-year Army ROTC National Scholarships for the fall of 2007. 21 of those were offered to out of state high school students. 35 of them were for USA, 4 for SHC and 1 for UM. The ACT scores of those winners range from 19 to 30 and the majors range from Meteorology to Pre-Med. Over the next four years this will bring \$1,788,832 to the three schools. Currently 30 have accepted the scholarship and plan on joining our program in the fall, and 4 more are yet undecided.


