1978

COL (P) Robert W. Kenyon has been selected for promotion to Brigadier General and took command of the 11th Military Police Brigade, Ashley, Pennsylvania on 7 July.

MAJ (Ret) Keith Seagle, LPC has been elected a City Commissioner for the city of Dothan, AL. He is currently the Director Of Counseling & Career Services for Troy University in Dothan, Alabama. Keith answered the call to civic duty and defeated the incumbent with a grass roots campaign emphasizing responsiveness to voter concerns. Keith is married to a fellow USA class of '78 graduate, the former Deborah Smith. Dothan is city of approximately 60,000 persons in Southeast Alabama. Commissioner-elect Seagle takes office in October '07 for a four year term.

COL (Ret) Greg King was commissioned as a RA Military Intelligence officer. After his first assignment as an Armor Battalion S-2 (for then-LTC Wes Clark), he went to flight school and flew Hueys in Korea and CONUS until transitioning to Blackhawks. 
