

Many school counselors will be retiring soon and this will result in an increased need for trained counselors. The increasing growth in school enrollment, combined with mandates which require elementary schools to have counselors, should result in increased growth for the school counseling profession. Some school counselors work in employment settings where their primary focus is on helping students make good career decisions and assist clients with job placement. School counselors also work in kindergarten through high school settings assisting students in coping with personal and social decisions, career and educational planning, and college choices. School counselors and pyschometrists may often take part in multidisciplinary decision making processes in the school and assist in developing individualized educational plans.
