

## **Geology Tenure Track Position, Department of Earth Sciences, The University of South Alabama**

The University of South Alabama Earth Sciences Department invites applications for a full-time (9 month) tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level beginning August 15, 2017. Candidates with research experience in Sedimentology, Sedimentary Petrology or related sub-disciplines are particularly encouraged to apply. A Ph.D. in Geology is required at the time of appointment. The successful candidate will be expected to establish a vibrant, externally-funded research program and to supervise undergraduate research projects. Collaborative graduate research opportunities are available through related disciplines.

Candidates selected for this position must be proficient in written and spoken English, demonstrate excellence in teaching and assume responsibility for undergraduate courses in Sedimentology, Introductory Geology, and possible graduate courses in their field of expertise. Active participation in the undergraduate summer field geology course is also required.
