

DEPARTMENT CHAIR OF RADIOLOGIC SCIENCES

The University of South Alabama invites nominations and applications for the position of Chair of the Department of Radiologic Sciences (open rank). Minimum qualifications include an earned doctorate in a related field and administrative experience. A master's degree with ARRT certifications may be considered if the candidate has a proven record of research, strong and effective leadership in an academic institution, and doctoral studies are in progress but pending completion. Successful candidates should show evidence of commitment to excellence in teaching, clinical education, service, and scholarship. Responsibilities will include teaching, engaging in scholarship, mentoring faculty, participating in service, and overseeing departmental operations. The Chair is expected to provide strategic vision and leadership to the Department as it explores opportunities to expand its impact on the profession. The Department offers the B.S. degree in Radiologic Science which includes specialty tracks in radiography, radiation therapy, mammography, CT, MRI, vascular radiography, ultrasound, and radiology administration.

Located in Mobile near the Mobile Bay Estuary and the Alabama Gulf coast with its beautiful white-sand beaches, the University of South Alabama is a public, doctoral-level institution enrolling more than 16,600 students in nine colleges and schools. With its Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, and Allied Health Professions and two teaching hospitals, it serves as a health services center for the region. Mobile is the center of a growing, two-county, metropolitan area (~600,000 residents) with a diverse economy.

Application review begins October 31, 2016 and will continue until the position is filled. The anticipated start date is June 2017, however an earlier date may be available.
