

## **Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology Tenure-track Faculty Position**

The University of South Alabama (USA) is accepting applications for a tenure-track faculty position for Audiology or Speech-Language Pathology. This is a 12-month position at the rank of assistant or associate professor. Salary is competitive. Requirements include a Ph.D. or equivalent terminal degree (ABD considered) and CCC in SLP or AUD. Primary duties include development of a personal research program; teaching at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral levels; mentoring student research; and limited clinical teaching. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. Candidates with expertise in pediatrics (AUD or SLP) will be given principal consideration. The USA graduate programs in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology are accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation. The USA Speech and Hearing Clinic and its affiliated ENT practice are housed within the Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology, one of eight departments in the Pat Capps Covey College of Allied Health Professions. USA's Colleges of Allied Health Professions, Medicine, and Nursing, as well as the USA teaching hospitals and clinics, offer a wide variety of research opportunities and teaching support for faculty and students. USA, a research rich institution, is located in the historic and vibrant gulf coast city of Mobile.
