

Audiology Assistant/Associate Professor Tenure-Track Position

The University of South Alabama (USA) invites applications for a 12-month tenure-track Audiology faculty position at the Assistant/Associate Professor level. Salary is competitive. Requirements include a Ph.D. (ABD may be considered), with preference given to CCC-A and state licensure eligibility. Primary responsibilities include teaching at the B.S., Au.D., and Ph.D. levels, development of an independent research program, mentoring student research, and providing service to the university, community, and profession. Qualified candidates in all areas of expertise are encouraged to apply, with preferred expertise in pediatric audiology or amplification.

The Speech Pathology and Audiology Department, with a 50-year history, and clinical graduate programs accredited by the CAA of ASHA, offers four degrees, including B.S. in Speech and Hearing Sciences, M.S. in Speech-Language Pathology, Au.D. in Audiology, and Ph.D. in Communication Sciences and Disorders. The USA Speech and Hearing Center and affiliated ENT practice is located within the department and provides comprehensive audiology and speech pathology services, with dual missions to serve the community and offer clinical education to students. A wide variety of research and clinical collaboration opportunities exist within the university, including the eight departments in the Pat Capps Covey College of Allied Health Professions, the College of Medicine, the College of Nursing, the two University Hospitals, the Mitchell Cancer Institute, and other colleges/units on campus.
