1. For each of the following compute the derivative of y with respect to x . That is find y' , $f'(x)$, or $\frac{dy}{dx}$ (Same things — different notation). Do not simplify your answer! (6 points each)

(a) $f(x) = x^2 - 3x + 2$

(b) $y = \frac{x}{x^2-1}$

(c) $y = (x^3 + 3x - 4)^{-5}$

(d) $f(x) = e^x \cos(x)$

(e) $f(x) = x^2 \cos(x - \frac{\pi}{2})$

(f) $f(x) = \cos(x^3 + 3x + 2)$

(g) $\cos(x) + \sin(y) = 1$

(h) $y = e^{\sqrt{x}} \cos(\ln(x))$

(i) $f(x) = \sqrt{(1-x^2)}$

(j) $y = \ln \sqrt{(x^2 + 1)}$

(k) $x^2 + y^2 = 1$

(l) $f(x) = 2^{x^3-4}$

2. (8 points) Use similar triangles, the squeeze theorem for limits, and the fact the the area of a circular sector subtended by an angle θ is $A(\theta) = \frac{R^2\theta}{2}$ where R is the radius to show that

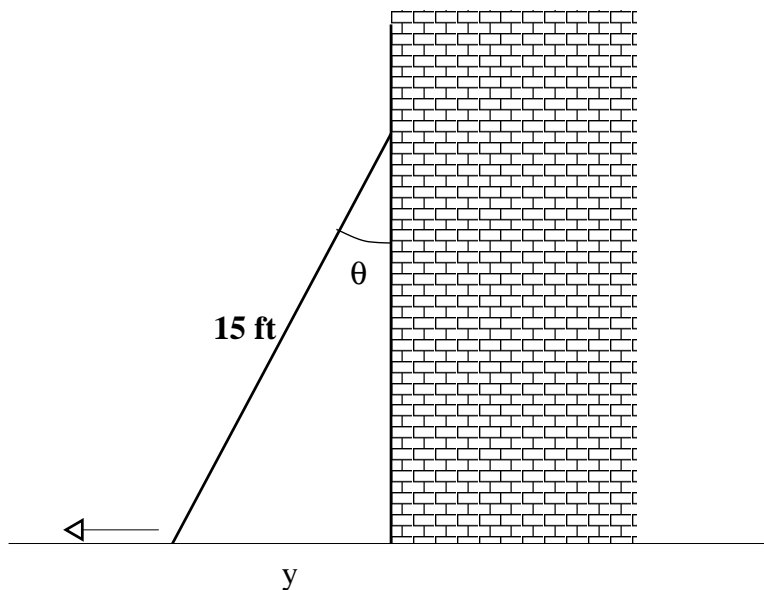
$$\lim_{h \downarrow 0} \frac{\sin(\theta)}{\theta} = 1$$

3. (10 points) An anvil thrown upward from the edge of a 496 foot cliff moves vertically along a straight line according to the equation,

$$s(t) = -16t^2 + 80t + 496$$

where $t \geq 0$ is measured in seconds, and the vertical position, s , is measured in feet.

- (a) Sketch a graph of the velocity as a function of time. Include an appropriate domain.
- (b) When does the anvil reach its acme (highest point)?
- (c) What is the velocity of the anvil as it hits the ground ($s(t) = 0$)?
- (d) When does the anvil pass the edge of the cliff?
- (e) What happens to the Coyote?
4. (10 points) The diagram below indicates a 15 foot ladder leaning against a wall. The bottom of the ladder slides away from the wall. Find the rate of change of the distance from the wall with respect to the angle θ when the angle is $\pi/3$.



Find $\left. \frac{dy}{d\theta} \right|_{\theta = \frac{\pi}{3}}$
