Dr. Alan Katz currently serves as Chief of Radiation Oncology at Winthrop University Hospital in Mineola, NY and is a Clinical Assistant Professor

at the SUNY School of Medicine at Stony Brook. Dr. Katz is a graduate of Yale College, the NYU School of Medicine and the NYU School of Law. He is a nationally renowned expert in stereotactic radiosurgery.



Dr. Itzhak Avital currently serves in the Surgery Branch, Tumor Immunology Division, of the National Cancer Institute. Dr.

Avital is a graduate of the NYU School of Medicine. He served as Chief Resident in the Department of Surgery at the UCLA Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, as well as completing a three year research fellowship in the Bioartificial Liver Support Laboratory. Returning to New York, he completed clinical fellowships in Surgical Oncology and Hepatobiliary Surgery at the Memorial Sloan - Kettering Cancer Center. His clinical interests are in the surgical management of complex diffuse metastatic malignancies with a focus on colorectal, liver, pancreatic, gastric and breast cancers.



Dr. Todd Blodgett is a nationally renowned physician and PET/CT imaging pioneer. He leads the Molecular

Imaging Division of Foundation Radiology Group of Pittsburgh and serves as an Assistant Professor of Radiology at the Hillman Cancer Center, University of Pittsburgh. Prior to joining the Foundation Radiology Group in 2010, Dr. Blodgett served as Chief of Cancer Imaging at the Hillman Cancer Center. Dr. Blodgett holds a B.S. degree in Neuroscience, as well as an M.D. from the University of Pittsburgh. He also completed two fellowships, one in PET and PET/CT, and another in Oncologic Imaging at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.



Dr. Rock Mackie is a professor at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Department of Medical Physics, and

Director of Medical Devices at Morgridge Institute for Research. He is a founder of Tomotherapy, Inc. and currently serves on its board. Dr. Mackie was also a founder of Geometrics Corporation that developed the Pinnacle TM treatment planning system. Dr. Mackie earned his Ph.D. in Physics from the University of Alberta Edmonton, Canada.
