There's no better place to learn the sociology of religion than in England. Here one can trace a 4000-year sweep of diverse and dramatic religious history that includes ancient cults, conquest, crusade, reformation, schism, war, empire, dissent, reform, secularization, and diversification. Participants will examine the intersections of Religion, Government, and Society in the English context: from ancient Druids to modern Muslim communities, from medieval witchcraft trials to the origins of modern science, from the Roman Empire to the Protestant Reformation. Included as part of the program students will have the opportunity to explore locations such as: Stonehenge/Avebury, The Roman Temples at Bath, Canterbury Cathedral, Regent's Park Mosque, The Jewish Museum, Westminster Cathedral and Abbey, Down House, and Cambridge.
