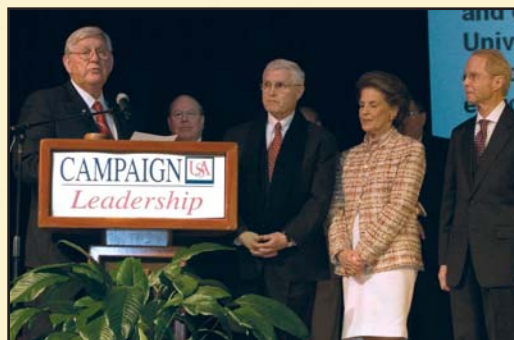




## MITCHELL CANCER INSTITUTE

- Created to increase Gulf Coast cancer survival rates through advanced treatment and research
- Currently provides more than 55,000 patient treatment contacts annually
- Largest single research endeavor in USA's history
- First academic cancer research institute in the upper Gulf Coast region
- Represents a total investment of more than \$125 million
- Funded through: philanthropic gifts; support from the State of Alabama; the City of Mobile and Mobile County; federal appropriations; competitive contracts and grants; tobacco settlement funds; and the USA Foundation
- Abraham, Mayer and Arlene Mitchell made a \$22 million gift in 2006 to support the USAMCI
- Currently employs more than 300; will employ more than 700 employees and contribute more than \$1 billion to the Mobile area economy

- External contracts and grants for fiscal year 2011: \$52.8 million.

Meisler Hall, made possible in part by a gift from Herbert A. and Fanny R. Meisler of Mobile, offers a central location for student services.



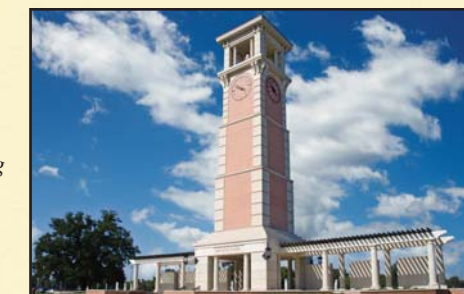
The state-of-the-art, 116,000-square-foot Student Recreation Center includes aerobic rooms, weight rooms, spinning rooms, basketball and racquetball courts, an indoor track, indoor and outdoor pools, saunas and a rock-climbing wall. 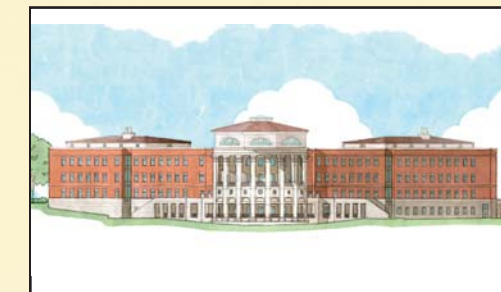
The Football Field House allows space for weight rooms, training rooms and the Jim and Frances Yance Coaches Suite. The new building is near the new football practice fields.



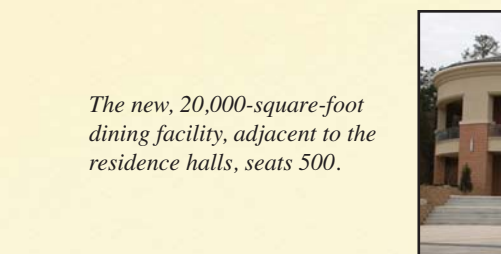
The Health Sciences Building provides a new home for the colleges of Allied Health Professions and Nursing.

Stokes Hall is a 330-room residence hall that introduces a new concept in campus life at USA. Built in response to increasing demand for campus housing, Stokes Hall includes an apartment for a "Faculty in Residence" and incorporates "Learning Communities," two of the latest trends on today's college campuses.
