In this program, high school students will be introduced to the fundamentals of bioengineering and chemical engineering while reinforcing their biology and chemical skills during participation in a series of hands-on design projects. In the first half of the course, students will design and fabricate a bioengineering device that electronically tracks body temperature. In the second half of the course, they will develop a process of extracting oil from plant material and convert it to biodiesel. 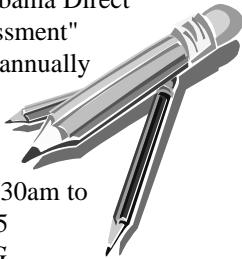
Summer Enrichment Camp in Writing Skills

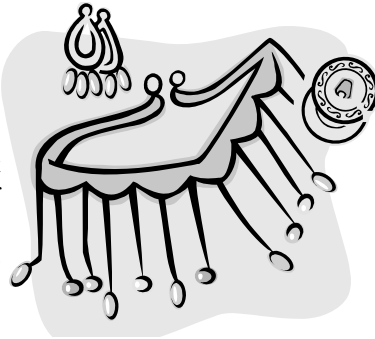
