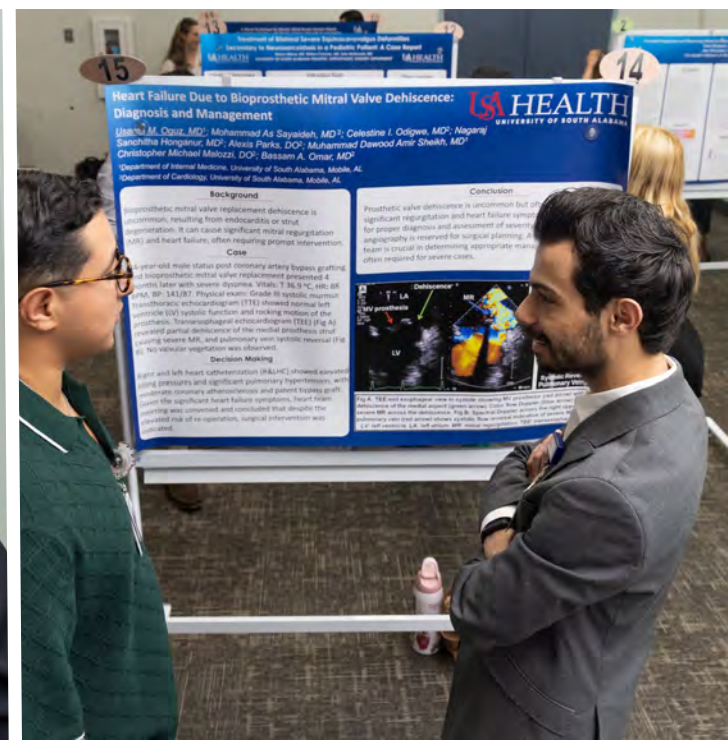

# The Ward Experience

4 week blocks

4 General ward services: Red, White, Blue, & Gold

- Typically 1 resident with 2-3 interns
- Cap 16 to a team

**Hospitalist Medicine Team (aka Green Medicine)**

- Upper level patient care responsibilities without team management responsibilities
- Provides protected rounding time for other traditional ward teams



# The Ward Experience

- Check-in time at 6:30am
- Day call ends at 4pm (short) or 7pm (long)
- Interns only take 1 overnight call per month
- Admissions occur using a drip system to spread out admits fairly. Swing shift service also assists with admits.

# The Night Float Experience

- Two 2 week blocks during intern and PGY 2 year
- 2 upper levels with 2 interns
- Provide cross coverage for general internal medicine teams
- Admit new patients primarily from the ED or transfers from outside institutions
- 7pm arrival time
- 6:30am check out to assist with getting night float team out on time

# The Intern ICU Experience

- 4 week rotation during intern year
- 3-4 interns with 4-5 upper level residents and a pulmonary/critical care fellow
- Rounds and admissions from 7am-4pm on most days
- Admit patients to MICU as floor transfers, from the ED, and transfers from other facilities
- 2-4 night shifts per month. Assigned with upper level resident and designed to provide intern with more experience with ICU admissions

# The Ambulatory Experience

## 4+2 schedule

4 weeks inpatient and 2 weeks outpatient

## 4 medicine clinic sessions per week

3 routine and 1 acute

## Subspecialty experience

Subspecialty focused outpatient exposure begins during PGY 1 year

On-site rotations – *Cardiology, endocrinology, nephrology, hematology/oncology, gastroenterology, hepatology, rheumatology, etc.*

Other experiences – *Dermatology, neurology, ENT, women's health, etc.*

## Longitudinal Electives

Opportunities to attend clinics in an area of interest longitudinally over the course of the year

**We also include built-in time for independent study and quality improvement participation.**
