Residency Program Structure

4+2 Block System

Typical Intern Schedule

- 20 weeks – Inpatient Wards
- 4 weeks – Emergency Medicine
- 4 weeks – Night Float (two 2-week blocks)
- 12 weeks – Ambulatory (Primary care continuity clinic sessions and other ambulatory care experiences such as clinic sessions with dermatology, sickle cell, gastroenterology, oncology, etc.) Includes longitudinal experience in neurology.
- 4 weeks – Critical Care
- 8 weeks – Subspecialty Consultative Services (Typically infectious disease, nephrology, & cardiology)
- *Preliminary interns follow a similar schedule, but we do individualize those schedules to best prepare for future training.*

4 weeks of vacation a year plus holiday schedule

6 months of individualized curriculum in PGY 2 & PGY 3 years

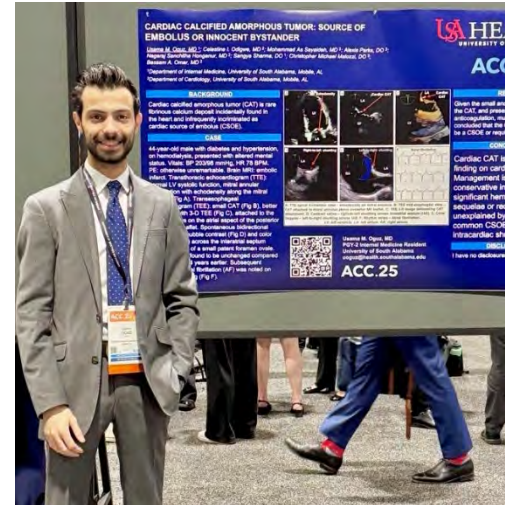
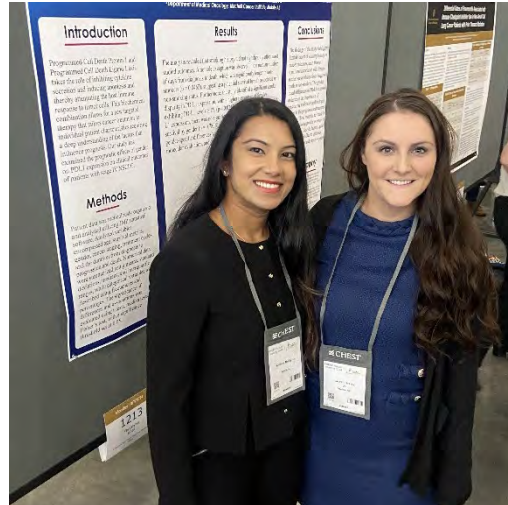
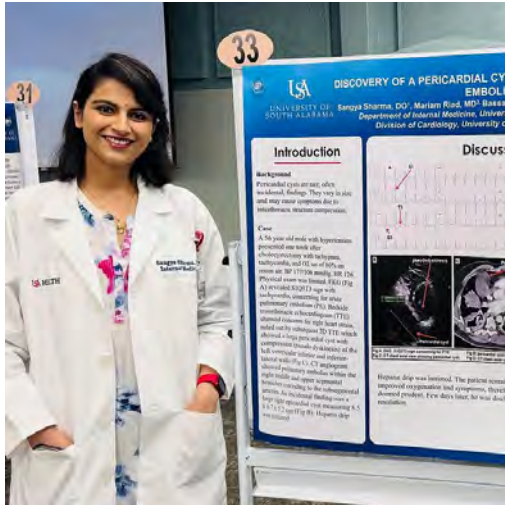
