Academic Probation Policy

Per the University of South Alabama Academic Probation Policy, students with a cumulative grade point average below 2.0 are having academic difficulties and are alerted to this fact by being placed on academic probation. Students on academic probation are placed on an advising hold and are required to meet with their academic advisor to discuss their course load and plans for the upcoming semester. Students will not be able to adjust or make changes to their schedule until they speak with their academic advisor or designated staff in their dean's office.

Students with grade point averages less than those listed in the table found in the [University Bulletin online](#) and shown below are subject to academic suspension or dismissal.

Students in the College of Engineering placed on Academic Probation must meet with either Dr. Tom Thomas, Associate Dean for Undergraduate Affairs or Ms. Nani Perez-Uribe, Supervisor of Student Services & Advising *prior* to the two-week advising period set forth by each department for academic advising.

The two-week academic advising period is primarily for faculty advisors to meet with their advisees to review and discuss schedule plans for the upcoming semester. A more lengthy conversation is needed for those on academic probation and there is not sufficient time for that conversation during academic advising.

Should a student not meet for academic probation advising, their hold will remain until they have met with Dr. Thomas or Ms. Perez-Uribe and they will be unable to register for classes. This policy applies to all College of Engineering undergraduate students who have matriculated into the College of Engineering and have enrolled in or have completed MA 126 Calculus II.
