As sole faculty of the Ultrasound Program, the Program Director will provide instruction for the didactic curriculum, provide oversight of the clinical curriculum, and maintain, assess and interpret data gathered during the academic year for the annual report to both the college and the Joint Review Committee on Education in Diagnostic Medical Sonography (JRCDMS). The Program Director is also responsible for maintaining JRCDMS standards and all documentation related to this. Expectations include participation in standing departmental committees and conduct of scholarly activities consistent with the goals of the department, college, and university.

Applicants for the rank of Instructor must have a Master's degree in a related field, must be registered with the American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers with multiple certifications, and a minimum of 3 years clinical experience. A doctoral degree, 2 years teaching experience, and experience as a Program Director is preferred.

To be considered for the rank of Senior Instructor, the applicant must have a minimum of 7 years, full-time teaching experience in an accredited program, ARRT certification in radiography, ARDMS registration in a minimum of four areas, experience as a Program Director, and demonstrate active participation in professional organizations.
