THE DEPARTMENT OF COUNSELING & INSTRUCTIONAL SCIENCES in the College of Education & Professional Studies at the University of South Alabama is seeking applicants for a full-time, non-tenure track, Assistant Professor (9-month) in Educational Technology. This position renews annually.

THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH ALABAMA is a diverse and vibrant public university that is making a difference in the lives of the people of Alabama and the nation through teaching, research, service and health care. The University offers a wide range of high-quality undergraduate and graduate academic programs to more than 15,500 students. Located in the City of Mobile, USA is the only major public institution of higher learning on the upper Gulf Coast and is among the fastest growing universities in the region.

THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION & PROFESSIONAL STUDIES is one of nine colleges and schools of the University of South Alabama. Founded on February 1, 1967, the college serves approximately 1,500 graduate and undergraduate students. With a total annual budget exceeding 14 million dollars, the College supports a broad array of degree programs. The College is nationally accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education and our educator preparation programs are accredited by the Alabama State Department of Education.

THE DEPARTMENT OF COUNSELING & INSTRUCTIONAL SCIENCES currently has 11 full-tenure track faculty, 1 non-tenure track instructional faculty, and 1 staff member. The Department offers a bachelor's degree in instructional design and performance improvement, master's programs in library media, educational technology, school and clinical mental health counseling (accredited by CACREP), and instructional design. The Department delivers a doctoral program in instructional design and co-delivers, along with the Department of Psychology, a doctoral program in clinical and counseling psychology accredited by the American Psychological Association.

RESPONSIBILITIES will primarily be to teach courses in educational media and technology for teacher education programs at the undergraduate and graduate level. Additionally, teaching, and potentially coordination of, the Educational Technology M.S. program would be part of the faculty member's responsibilities. Finally, this hire would participate in departmental, college and university service duties at the direction of the department chair. Service could also include developing research and service partnerships around technology with K-12 schools in the region.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS include an earned doctoral degree in Educational Technology, or a closely related field such as Instructional Design or Library Science. Degrees in closely related fields must include a minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in educational technology. Applicants who have completed their doctoral coursework, but are currently finishing their dissertation project will also be considered. Applicants must have evidence of teaching competency in the field of educational media and technology.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS include applicants who can demonstrate skills related to applying technology to learning environments, and who can teach coursework related to this issue. In particular, applicants will have experience teaching educational technology to pre-service teachers, and direct experience in K-12 settings working with technology is very desired.

COMPLETED APPLICATIONS must include a letter of interest, a current curriculum vitae, official transcripts, and three signed original letters of reference. Review of applicants' materials will begin February 28th, 2018, and continue until the position is filled.
