# UNIVERSITY REFUND POLICIES

The application fee, photo I.D. fee, orientation fee, and late registration fee are not refundable. The \$150 registration fee is non-refundable. A student who withdraws from a course or courses may claim a refund of course fees (100% refund during first week of classes, 50% refund during second week) and any refundable miscellaneous fees, according to the dates published in the University Calendar. For complete withdrawals, other fees are proportionately refunded based upon University and/or Federal Financial Aid. Residential students withdrawing from the University should refer to their housing contract for room and meal plan information.

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
