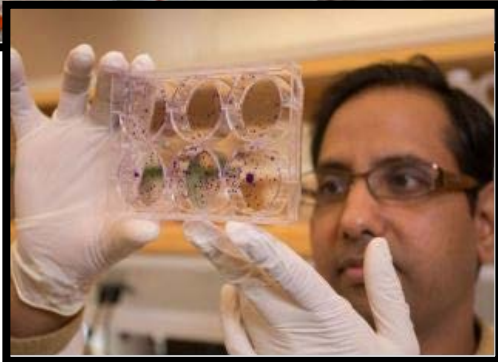

Dear Colleagues:

For FY 2015, the University received a total of \$58,967,598 in externally sponsored awards. The *Annual Report for FY 2015* is produced by the Office of Research and Economic Development and details externally-funded research activity, clinical trials, and intellectual property activity. Additionally, the *Annual Report for FY 2015* also includes a report detailing research expenditures for FY 2015, provided by the Division of Financial Affairs, and a record of awarded investigators which credits both principal investigators and co-investigators who receive funding.

Gross licensing revenues received in FY 2015 are reported by the Office of Intellectual Property Management and total \$2,327,964. The larger portion of this revenue was attributable to license agreement between the South Alabama Medical Science Foundation and a subsidiary of Merck KGaA. Other key statistics include twenty (20) invention disclosures submitted, fourteen (14) U.S. patents filed, three (3) U.S. patents issued, and one (1) license/option agreement executed.

We look forward to working with all of you to be strong partners in the advancement of fundamental and translational research here at the University of South Alabama.

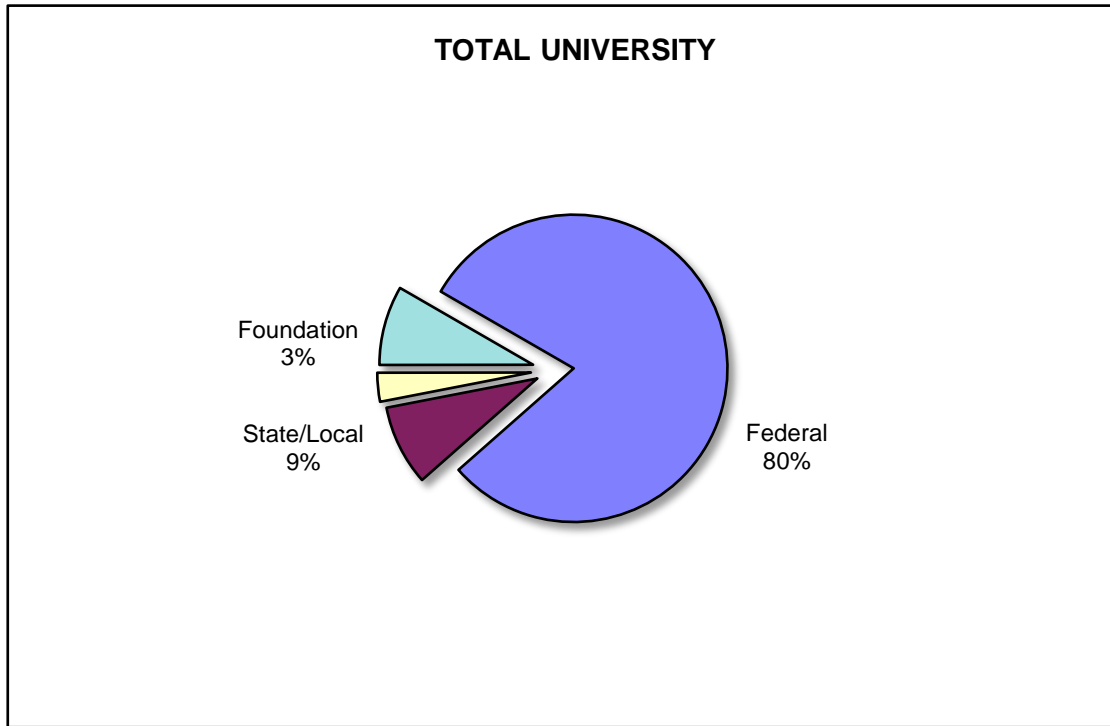

## BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2015

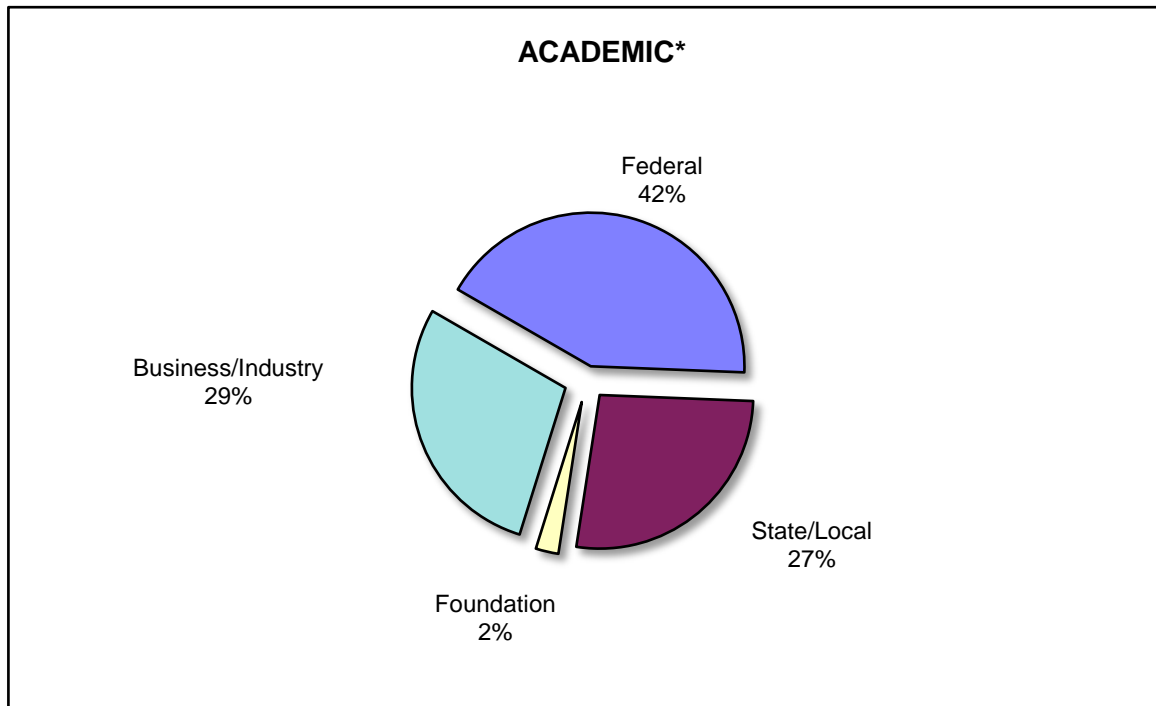

## BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2015

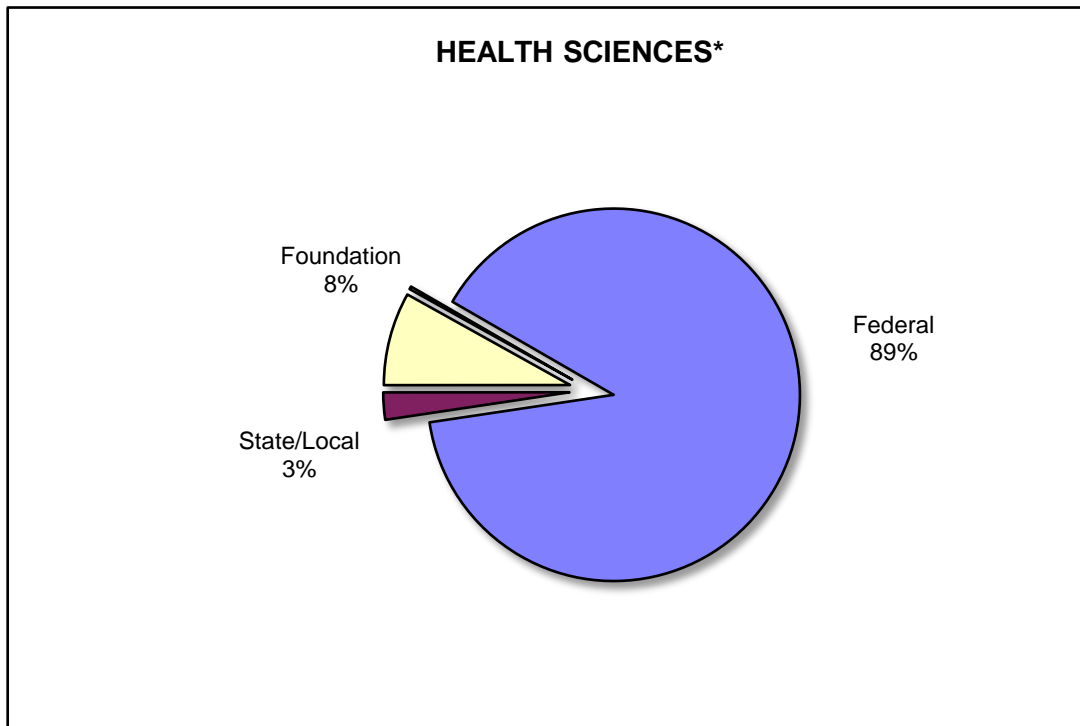

## BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2015

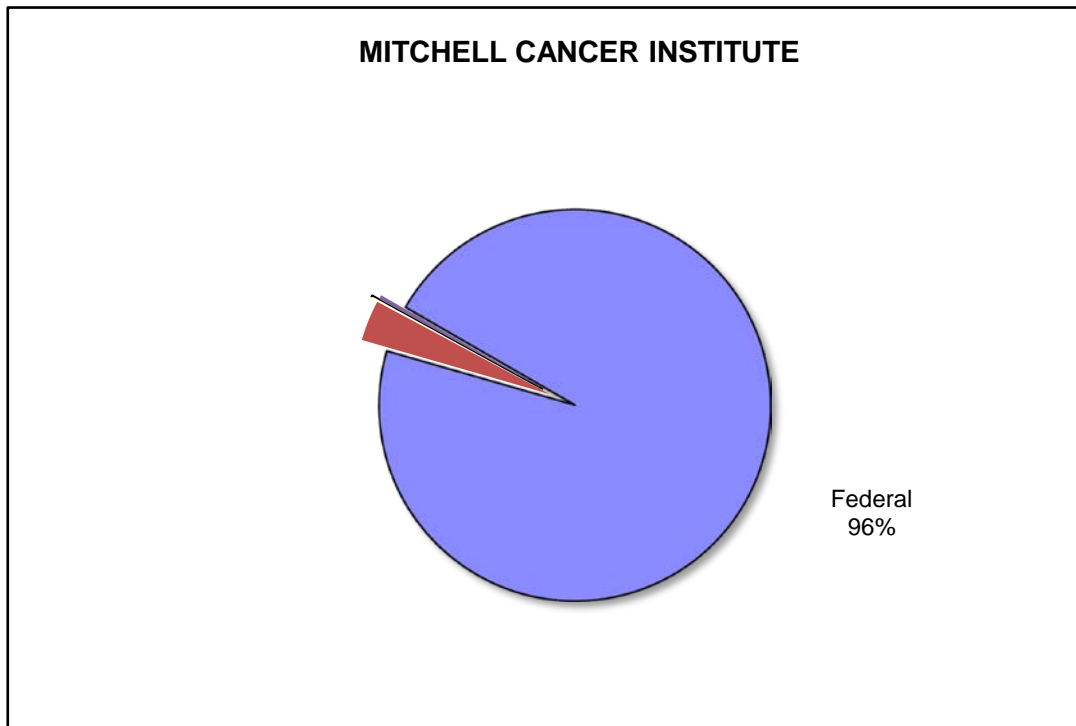

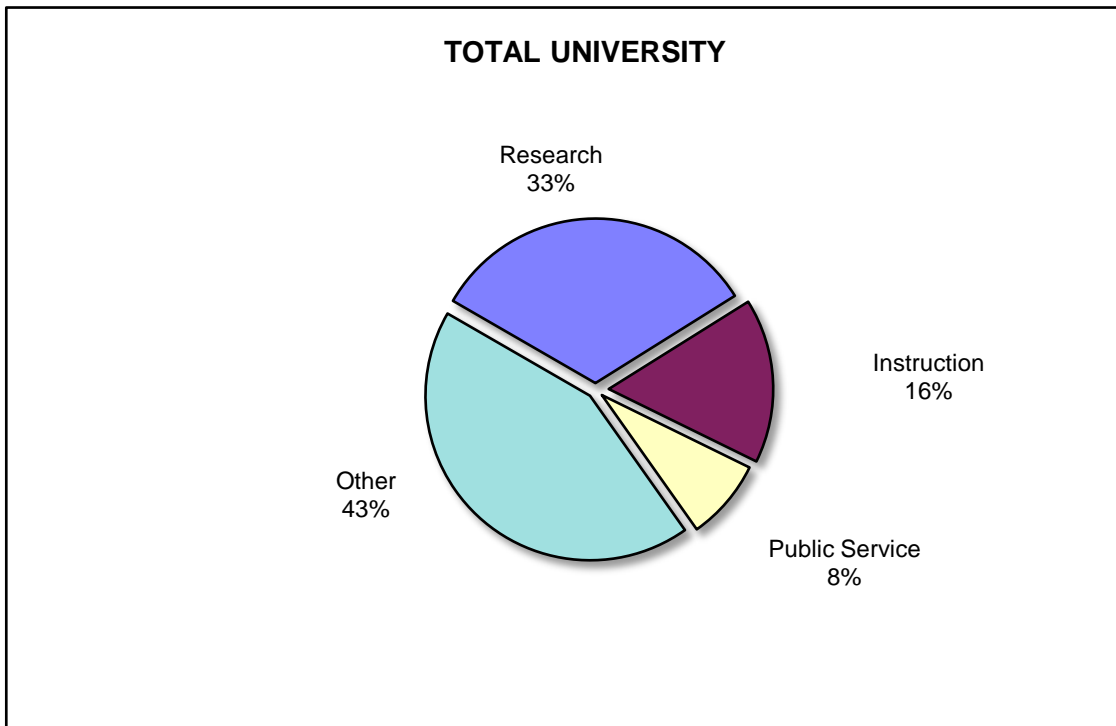

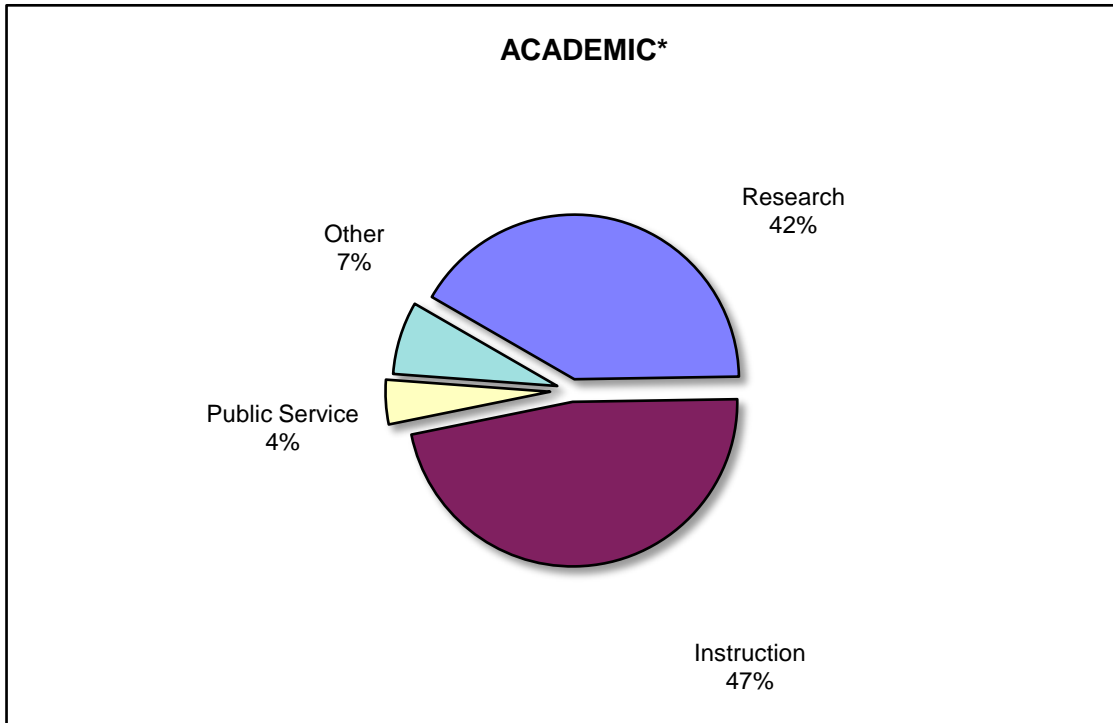
## BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2015

## BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2015

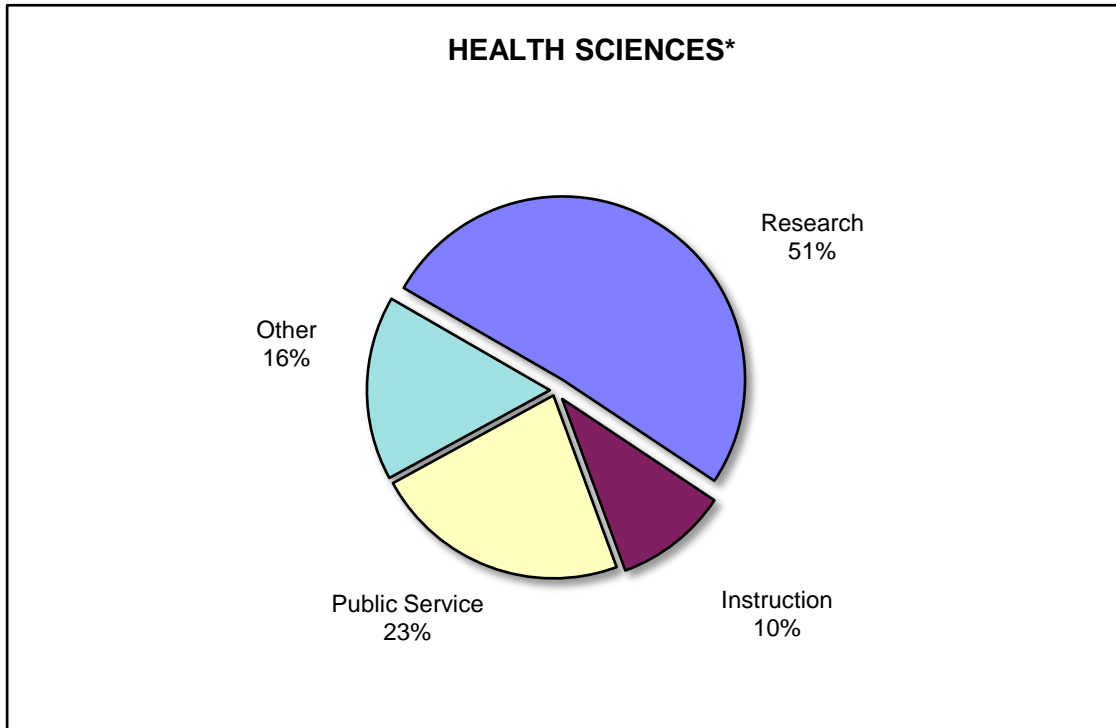

## BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2015

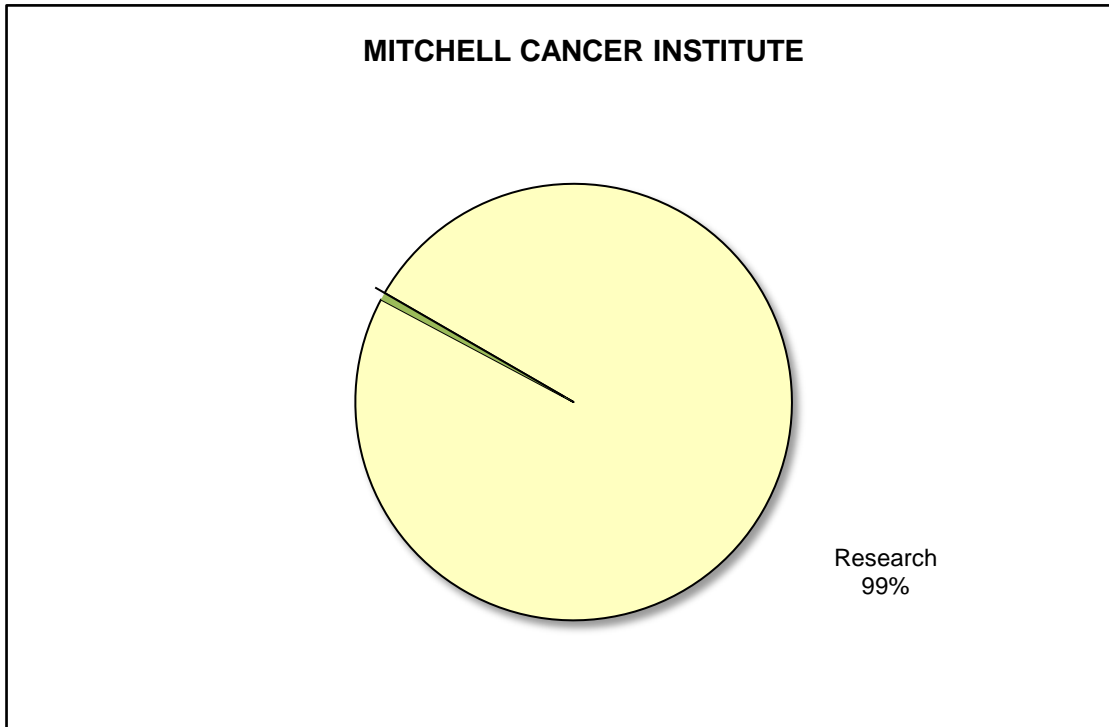

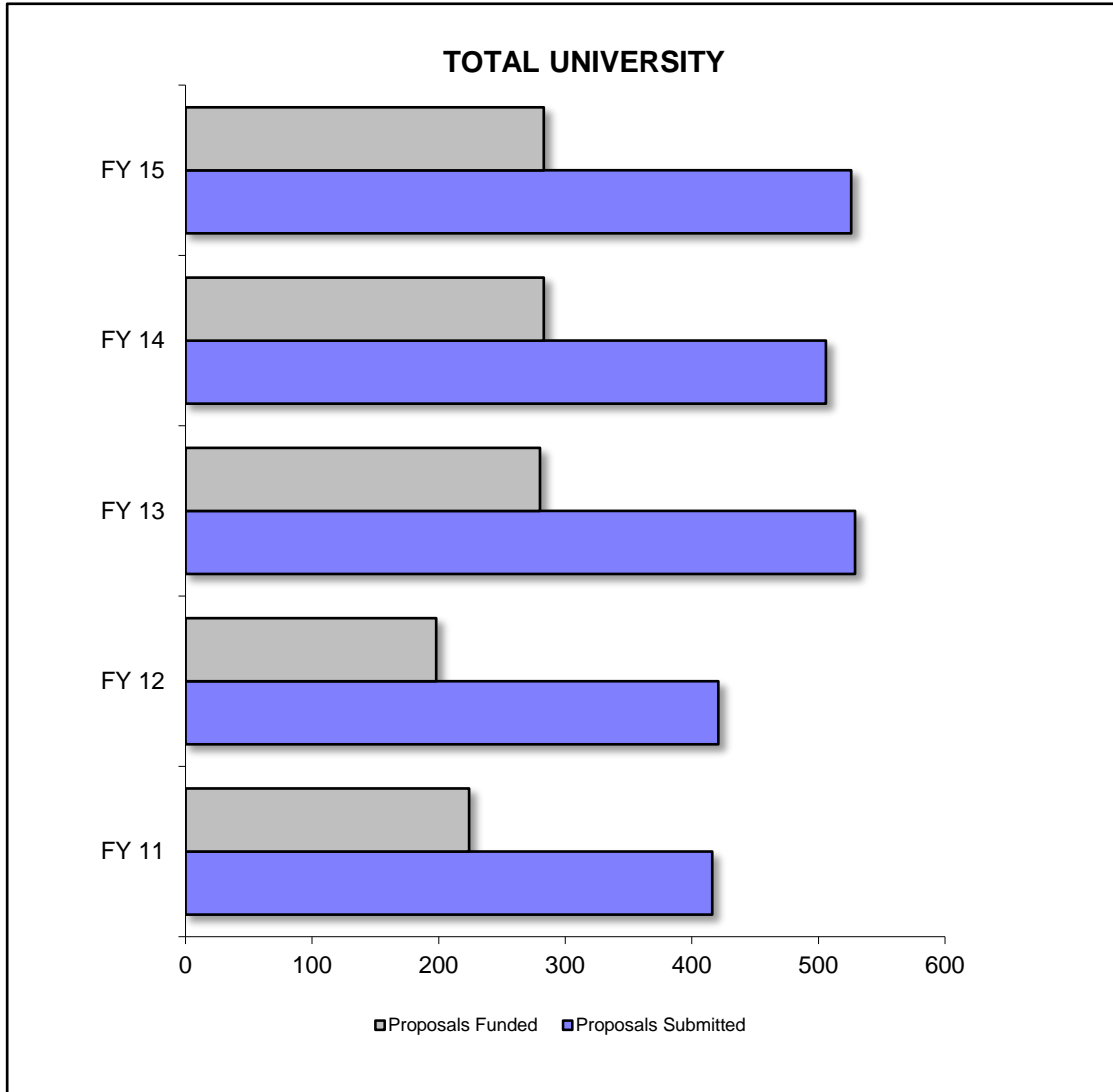

## BY UNIVERSITY TOTAL FY 11 - FY 15



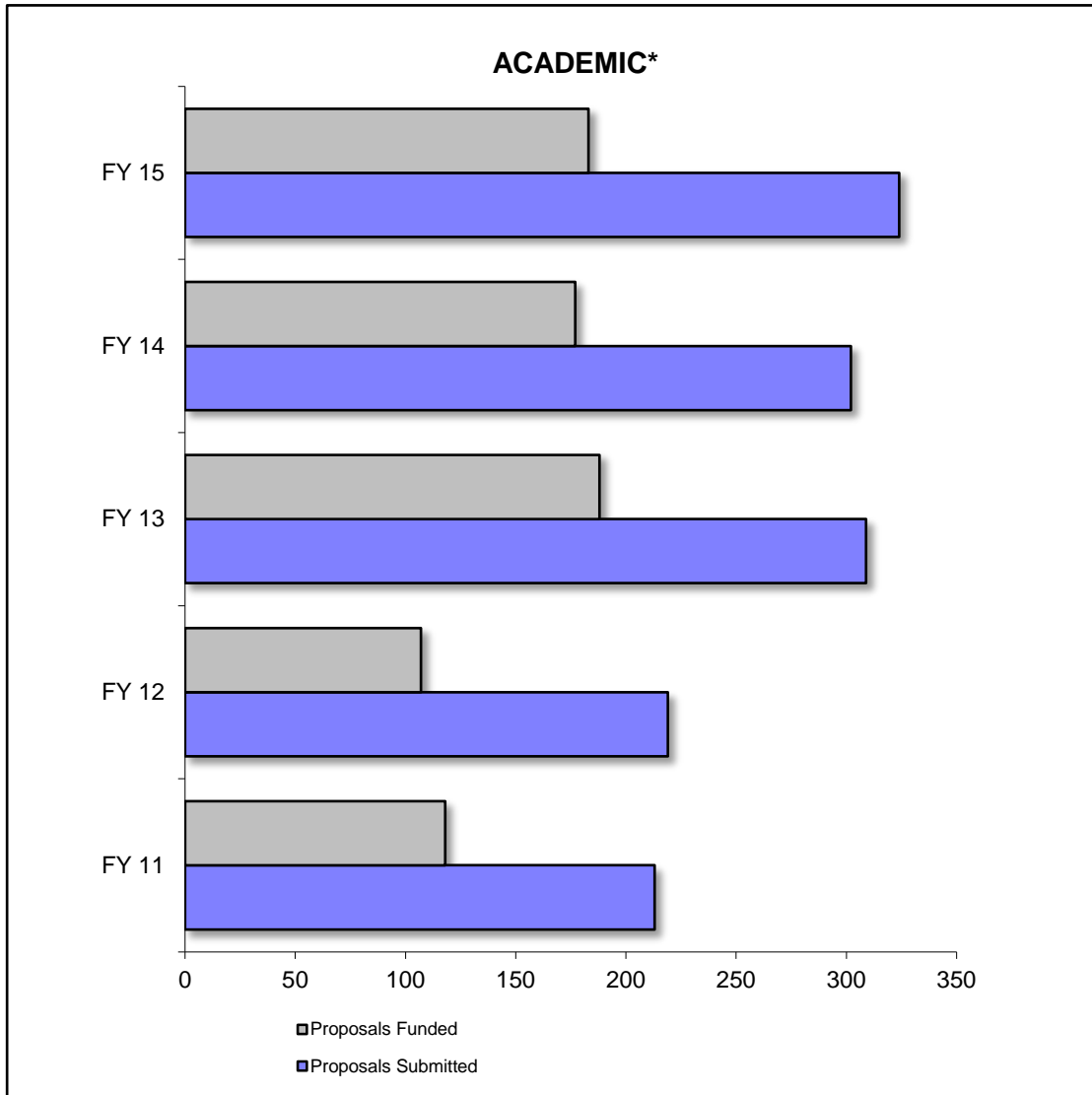

## BY ACADEMIC FY 11 - FY 15

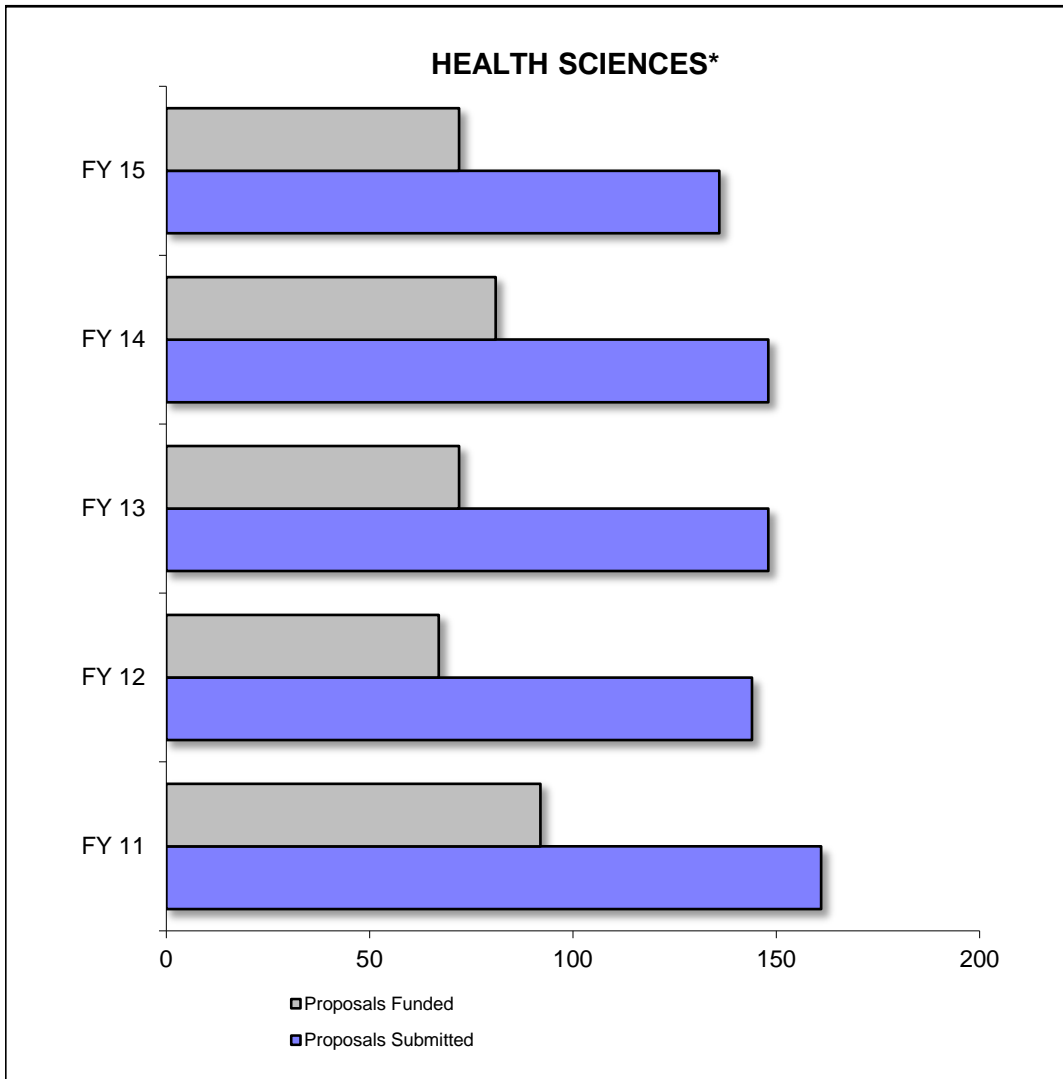

## HEALTH SCIENCES FY 11 - FY 15

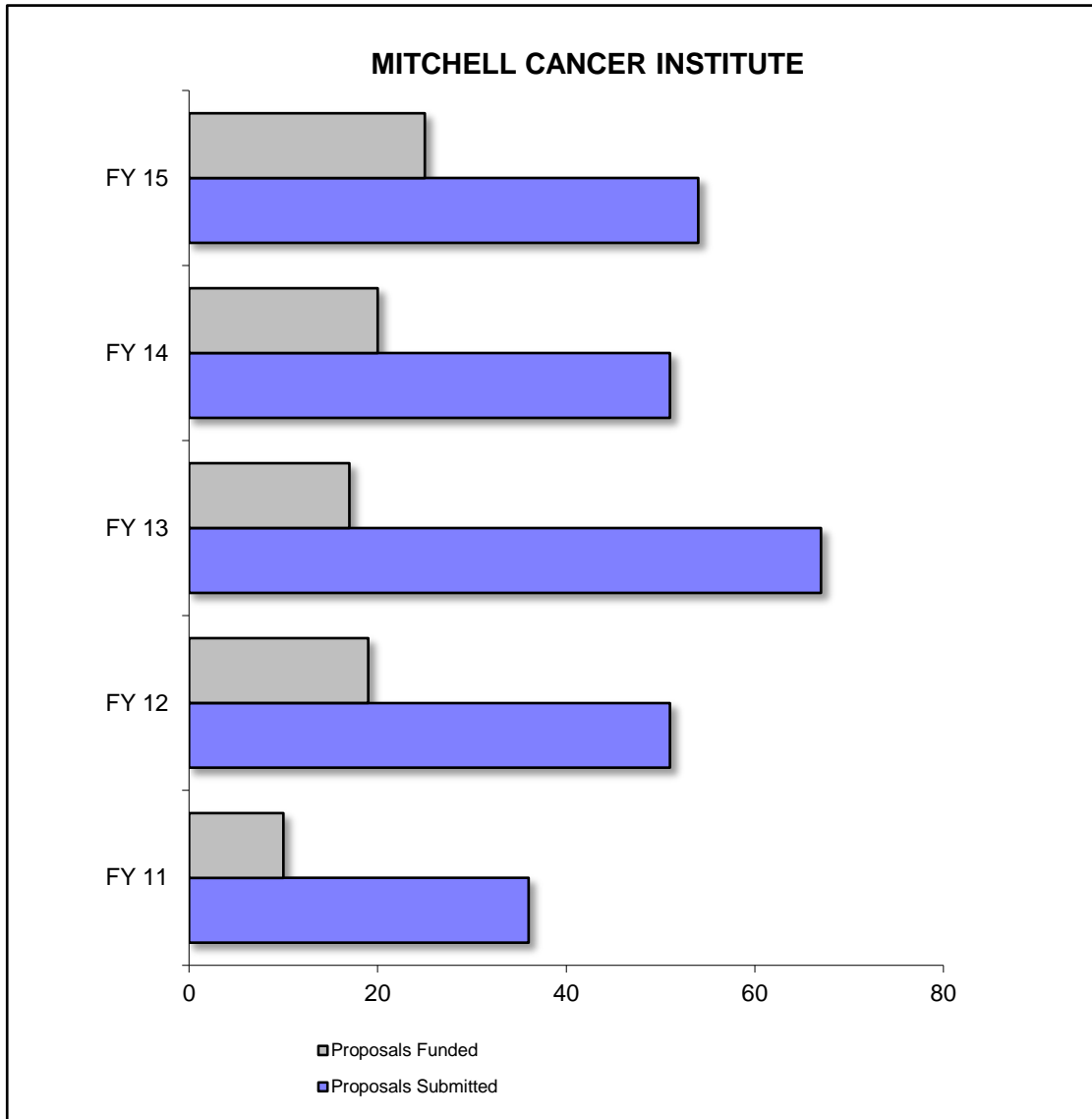
