
CALL FOR PAPERS AND PANEL PROPOSALS

THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL GULF SOUTH HISTORY AND HUMANITIES CONFERENCE



Conference Theme: "Pleasure and Happiness in the Gulf South"
October 9-11, 2014
Galveston, Texas

The Gulf South History and Humanities Conference is an annual event sponsored by the Gulf South Historical Association, a consortium of colleges and universities from the states of Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas. This year's host institution is Tyler Junior College, of Tyler, Texas. Concurrently, this year we also welcome participation from the Gulf States Consortium of Medieval and Renaissance Scholars.

The Thirty-Second Annual Conference invites proposals for papers, panels, roundtables, documentaries, and performances. Our focus is the history and culture of the Gulf South states, Caribbean islands, countries of the Caribbean rim, and the Gulf's maritime history. Proposals related to this year's theme of "Pleasure & Happiness" are especially welcome. David Emory Shi, past-president of Furman University, will give our keynote address on "The Pursuit of Happiness in American History." Dr. Shi co-authors W. W. Norton's best-selling textbook, *America: A Narrative History*, and is the author of *The Simple Life: Plain Living & High Thinking in American Culture* (Oxford, 1985). Twice-nominated for the Pulitzer Prize, Shi is a newspaper essayist, NPR commentator, and a leading advocate for environmental sustainability.

Proposals will be considered if postmarked by July 1, 2014. To submit an individual paper, send a brief c.v., title, and short abstract. Panel organizers (two or more presenters, a chair and commentator, or a chair/commentator) must send a c.v., paper title, and short abstract for each participant. A complete list of conference sessions and topics will be mailed to each registrant in the first week of September 2014. Proposals for GSCMRS sessions will be appropriately forwarded.
